Re: Agenda items for City Council meeting on Monday, June 17, 2024, 6:30 p.m.

<u>Finance/Administration Committee</u> – There are two items for consideration through the Finance / Administration Committee.

Finance Director Pyle will provide an update on major tax collection trends.

2. Wood & Huston Bank approached the City about placing some deposits with them. The City does invest in certificates of deposits (CDs) with various institutions to earn a return on cash reserves while maintaining Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC) coverage as required by state statutes and the City's investment policies. In these practices, the City does favor using local banks as they are able to be competitive with their rates. Wood & Huston has quoted a favorable rate for a CD, so staff recommends adding the local bank as an authorized depository.

<u>Public Works Committee</u> – There are three items for consideration through the Public Works Committee.

- 1. As presented in the strategic plan, we continue to work through the storm water improvement master plan. We have been able to pick off a project or two each year as available funding has allowed. For this fiscal year, we were successful in securing a grant to accelerate the plan. Council approved contracts for four project areas in February and four more in May. During the construction of one of the projects it was determined the size of the drop inlet needs to be increased. Staff recommends adding \$7,480.00 to the contract for Storm Water Improvement Area 21.
- 2. Included in the current year budget appropriations are two pickups in each of the Water and Sewer Departments. Bids were solicited and W-K Chevrolet was the only bidder at \$43,606 each, and that bid was under the government bid contracts we looked at for comparison. These trucks are replacing 1999, 2000, 2005, and 2011 models of trucks with high mileage and in generally poor condition. Note that some of the reason for the delay in replacing these vehicles and now purchasing four at a time, is due to the supply chain disruptions from the pandemic that are now easing so that we can get back on schedule.
- 3. Two developments in the area of highways HH and 65 are moving forward. Both of these developments require water and will eventually require sewer extended to them. Theron Broadfoot, PE has been working with the developers and has done the preliminary site plans as well as obtaining the topology survey work. Therefore, staff has worked with him to develop a proposal to engineer the water lines and delineate the necessary easements. Staff recommends approval of the agreement for design services.

<u>Community Development Committee</u> – There are no items for consideration through the Community Development Committee.

<u>Public Safety Committee</u> – There is one item for consideration through the Public Safety Committee.

 At the last meeting, Council expressed some concerns about coverage of tornado warning sirens as well as if all are working. Chief Irwin provided some information about testing that was scheduled for later that week. Council passed a motion to direct staff to further study coverage and bring back a presentation on these sirens.

The City has adopted by reference several codes published by industry experts aimed at ensuring public safety. The International Code Council is comprised of certified code and building officials, engineers, firefighters, architects and other interested professionals who establish these codes. They are written with the intent to fit various situations but also reference industry standards. Codes are updated every 3 years. Current International Codes in use by the City are the 2015 version. City staff have reviewed the proposed 2021 Codes to compare with the 2015 codes. In February, four separate actions were taken which started the 90-day timeframe for them to lay for public inspection. Some questions were submitted but there were no suggested changes from the public. Councilwoman Foster added that FEMA will not pay full benefits in a disaster if codes are not updated.

The Public Safety Committee and staff have spent considerable time regarding the number and placement of Fire Stations taking into consideration the safety of citizens and what the City can support financially. This has been complicated by the temporary closure of the Washington Street bridge. The City has implemented a plan utilizing cameras and placement of fire vehicles on the north side alleviating the issue of trains blocking access. Replacement of the bridge is a long-term project that is out of the City's direct control. The Public Safety Committee's recommendation is to proceed with a two-station model, building one Station and Training facility behind the current Central station and proposed Bowling Alley and Aquatic Center. Motion by Robinson, seconded by Bloess to accept the Committee recommendation. All Present in Favor. Oldham was absent.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS FROM MAYOR/COUNCIL/ADMINISTRATOR:

Councilwoman Foster stated that during the last weather incident, some issues were experienced with the sirens in the 2nd and 4th Wards. She would like the issue to be addressed to ensure they are working. There are also no sirens near the High School. Councilwoman Boggess added that sirens in Hubbard park have been removed and she would like to see them restored. The placement of current sirens on the north side make it difficult to hear in certain sections. Fire Chief Matt Irwin stated that they will be conducting a siren test in conjunction with EMA which will assist in identifying any that are not functioning properly. He has also recommended sirens be placed near the High School and at Clover Dell Park. City Administrator Kelvin Shaw requested that the information be prepared and presented at the next City Council Meeting. Motion by Foster, seconded by Marshall to bring back a presentation on the siren results. All Present in Favor. Oldham was absent.

Councilman Bloess stated the public can say what they want about him but leave his family out of the issues. All Council members try to follow the Golden Rule of treating everyone with respect and treating people how you would like to be treated. He asked that we move forward in a positive way. No one is perfect but his wish is that the County would understand that the City's effort is to provide for public safety. Codes and practicing safety routines before they happen in very significant places, like the Jail is imminently important and saves lives. He does not appreciate the way some are going after him or City Administrator Shaw. He is proud to be a member of the City Council. They give their time and care significantly about the community.

Councilwoman Boggess announced that the NAACP will be having a Juneteenth Celebration on June 15 at Hubbard Park starting at 12:30 p.m. and invited everyone to attend.

City Administrator Shaw thanked Community Development Director John Simmons for another successful Scott Joplin Festival.

GOOD & WELFARE:

Debbie Covington, 2601 East 12th, stated that in response to Councilman Bloess' comments, unfortunately when you run for public office you open yourself up to public comment and scrutiny. If someone chooses to take it personally it's not, it is business. They are not attacking anyone and everyone is able to join their Facebook group and make comments.

David Goodson, 1640 Hedge Apple Drive, again placed a request to have meetings live streamed on Facebook. Mr. Goodson also commented that he did not get a response regarding Administrator Shaw's job rating. He expressed that the Council needs to work on fixing the real issues and replace those who need to be replaced.

Gary Lobaugh, 821 South Arlington, inquired if the funds for the Design-Build would come out of the Bond. He then spoke about the Washington Street bridge repair and inquired if the bridge belongs to Sedalia and if not, who? If it belongs to Sedalia, there is surely some way to fix the bridge. He asked if the Conflict of Interest was part of the oath Council takes.

Cory City, stated that Councilman Oldham commented in a town hall that the City does not want to own properties, however, there is no list of available properties for citizens. Mr. City suggested that they be put up for \$1,000.00 and include stipulations regarding building within a certain amount of time. Mr. City inquired if there was a way to put the audio for the GoTo meetings up so that people could listen to the discussion of what City Council votes on.

Rene Vance, PO Box 691, stated that she has been a proud member and passionate advocate for the Sedalia Senior Center and all citizens of Sedalia as a silver haired representative. She has recently volunteered and collected signatures for the Women's reproductive health initiative. The current representative has a very different view on women and equality. Through the last legislative session, it became clear to her that the rights of low-income families, women, Seniors and the LGBTQ community were not priority. She would be honored to serve Sedalia and Pettis County and asked for the community's support and vote in November.

David Fisher, stated he is a retired Battalion Chief and a native of Sedalia. When he was a child, he remembers that there were three Fire Stations in Sedalia. Mr. Fisher said he agrees with the proposed Fire Station plan and also supports the Firefighters and Police.

The meeting adjourned at 7:40 p.m. on motion by Foster, seconded by Marshall to a closed-door meeting in the upstairs conference room pursuant to subsections 1 (Legal Advice), 2 (Real Estate), 3 (Personnel) and 12 (Negotiated Contracts) of Section 610.021 RSMo. Roll Call Vote: Voting "Yes" were Robinson, Marshall, Boggess, Hiller, Cross, Foster and Bloess. No one voted "No". Oldham was Absent.

The regular meeting reopened and adjourned at 8:34 p.m. on motion by Foster, seconded by Hiller. All Present in favor. Oldham was Absent.

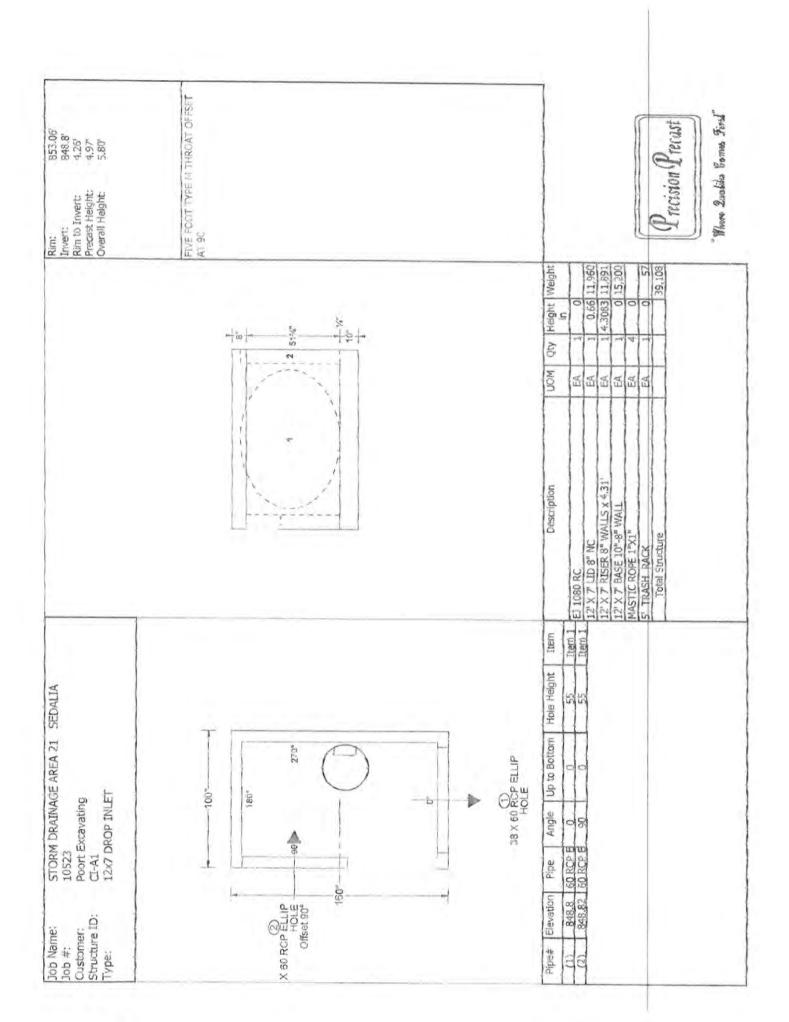
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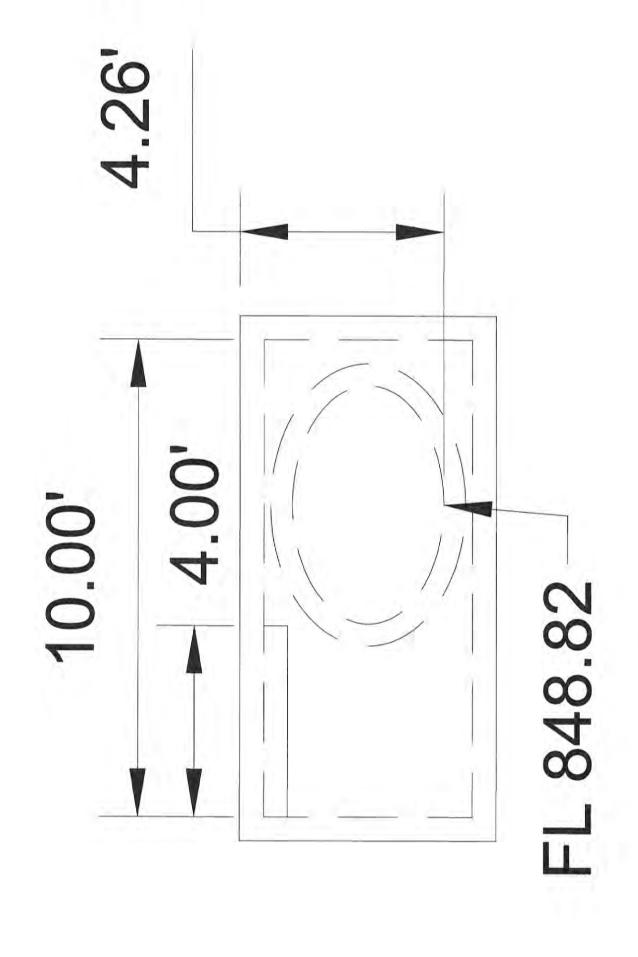

HWY 65 SUBJECT: DESIGN SERVICES - PUBLIC WATER MAIN EXTENSION ALONG

HWY 65 AND HWY HH – BREATIME TO NEW PETERBILT FACILITY

Background:

The City of Sedalia has been working with Peterbilt to provide utility services (water and wastewater) to their new facility, near the intersection of HWY HH and HWY 65. While specifically working with Peterbilt on this project, other adjacent landowners have been in contact with the City to inquiry about utilities and development. Mr. Theron Broadfoot has been the engineer working with the majority of the property owners in this area. He has an understanding of the owners needs and has worked with the City on many other projects and is currently under contract to design a sewer project on HWY 65.

Discussion:

Broadfoot Engineering has been working with the City and property owners in this area to assist in the design of water and wastewater utilities to best serve the needs of the property owners and the future needs of the City. For this specific, project Mr. Broadfoot had prepared four options for the City to review. After all considerations and reviewing the proposed options the consensus was to go with Option C1.

If you have any questions or need, additional information please let me know.

Recommendation:

City staff recommends approval of the Scope of Work from Broadfoot Engineer, LLC for professional surveying and civil engineering design, plans and specifications for the extension of a water main from the existing deadend water main located near Rebar Road and Radio Hill Road intersection, near Breaktime, to the new Peterbilt facility located to the north (Option C1). Approximate length of the water main is 4,300 linear feet; services as outlined in the proposal letter on a time and material basis with a Not-to-Exceed of \$49,000.00.

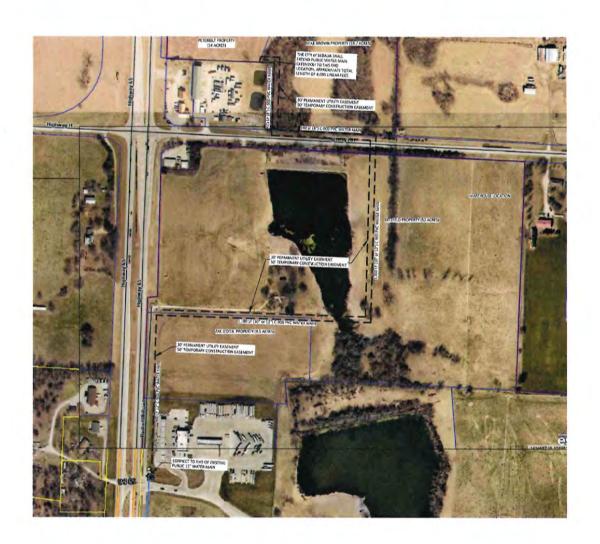

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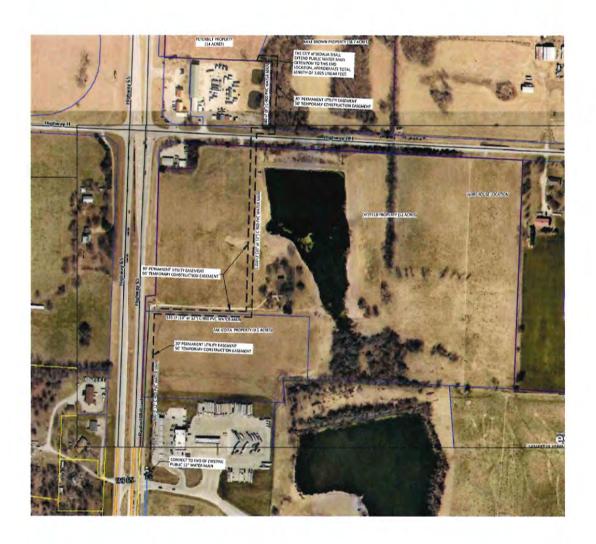

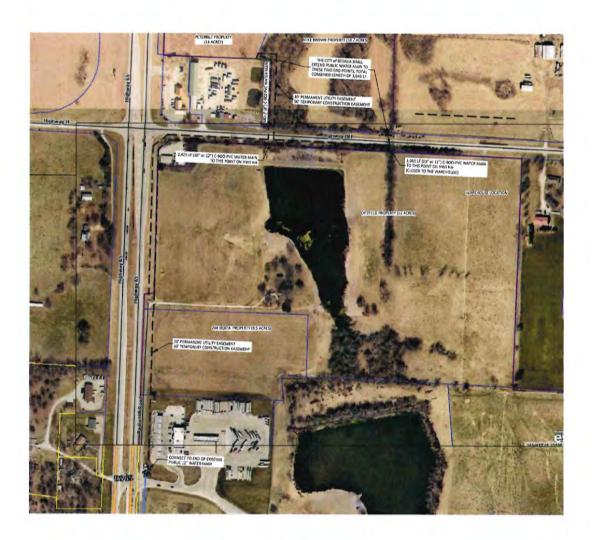
